
Daily Report 65/2020

18 March 2020¹

Summary

- Compared with the previous reporting period, the SMM recorded more ceasefire violations in Donetsk region and fewer in Luhansk region.
- Members of the armed formations displayed aggressive behaviour towards the SMM in Sofiivka, Donetsk region.
- The Mission continued monitoring the disengagement areas near Stanytsia Luhanska, Zolote and Petrivske; it recorded ceasefire violations inside the disengagement area near Petrivske. While present near the latter area, it saw unmanned aerial vehicles drop objects by parachutes nearby.
- The Mission continued to observe measures related to the COVID-19 outbreak at checkpoints in both Donetsk and Luhansk regions.
- It facilitated and monitored adherence to localized ceasefires to enable demining near Krasnyi Yar and maintenance to power lines near Shchastia and Slovianoserbsk.
- Restrictions of the SMM's freedom of movement continued, including due to the
 presence of mines and unexploded ordnance, and at checkpoints of the armed
 formations in southern Donetsk region as well as at a border crossing point outside
 government control in Luhansk region.*

Ceasefire violations²





In Donetsk region, the SMM recorded more ceasefire violations, including, however, a similar number of explosions (about 115), compared with the <u>previous reporting period</u> (about 120 explosions). The majority of ceasefire violations were recorded in areas northwest of Horlivka (non-government-controlled, 39km north-east of Donetsk), at northwesterly directions of Shyrokyne (government-controlled, 100km south of Donetsk) and at southerly directions of Petrivske (non-government-controlled, 41km south of Donetsk) (see below).

In Luhansk region, the SMM recorded fewer ceasefire violations, including fewer explosions (about 95) compared with the <u>previous reporting period</u> (about 940 explosions). The majority of ceasefire violations, including more than two thirds of the explosions, were recorded at south-westerly directions of Kriakivka (government-controlled, 38km north-west of Luhansk) and in areas south-west of Trokhizbenka (government-controlled, 32km north-west of Luhansk), including explosions of artillery rounds.

Aggressive behavior towards the SMM in Sofiivka and objects land near a patrol close to the Petrivske disengagement area

In Sofiivka (formerly Karlo-Marksove, non-government-controlled, 40km north-east of Donetsk), two armed members of the armed formations stopped an SMM patrol consisting of two vehicles and five patrol members. One of the members of the armed formations, who was visibly intoxicated, aggressively told the SMM to open the driver's door of the first vehicle, which the SMM did. He then pointed his rifle through the open door at the patrol members, and subsequently opened the rear left door while demanding that the patrol members disenbark the vehicle and open the trunk. After he moved away from the SMM vehicle to use a handheld radio, the SMM members closed all car doors and immediately locked them. The same member of the armed formations then tried to open the car doors while shouting agressively. After eight minutes, they allowed the SMM to proceed further.⁵

Positioned on a road about 1km north of Petrivske, the SMM heard a buzzing sound assessed as the engine of an unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV) at an assessed range of 400m-1km northeast of its position. After about two minutes, the SMM saw an unidentified object attached to a white/light grey parachute land about 400m north-east. About 50 minutes later, after moving to a position about 1.5km further north-north-east, the SMM saw a black UAV (delta-wing, more than 1m in width) flying at an assessed range of 200-300m south-east, and saw an unidentified about 1m-long object attached to a white/light grey parachute land about 400m south-south-east of the patrol's position. The SMM left the area.*

Disengagement areas near Stanytsia Luhanska, Zolote and Petrivske⁶

On 17 March, inside the **disengagement area near Stanytsia Luhanska** (government-controlled, 16km north-east of Luhansk), the Mission saw five members of the armed formations (wearing armbands with "JCCC" written on them) between the new span of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge (15km north-east of Luhansk) and their checkpoint south of it. The SMM also saw that two golf carts were operating between the entry-exit checkpoint (EECP) and the northern edge of the new span of the bridge.

On 14 March, on the northern edge of the **disengagement area near Zolote** (government-controlled, 60km west of Luhansk), an SMM mini-UAV spotted a stationary infantry fighting vehicle (BMP-1), as well as an armoured light utility truck (Practika, *Kozak-2*), driving north-east inside of the disengagement area from the direction of Katerynivka (government-controlled, 64km west of Luhansk). Outside the disengagement area, about 200m east and west of road T-1316, the UAV spotted two double rows of concertina wire running for about 200m towards the northern edge of the disengagement area.

On the same day, near former forward positions about 1km north of the southern edge of the disengagement area near Zolote, near a treeline, an SMM mini-UAV spotted approximately 120 holes in three rows, assessed as part of possible demining activities. About 500m north of the area's southern edge and about 20m west of road T-1316, the UAV <u>again</u> spotted 15 anti-tank mines.

On the evening of 16 March, the SMM camera in Zolote recorded four undetermined explosions at an assessed range of 3-6km east-north-east, assessed as outside the disengagement area but within 5km of its periphery.

On 17 March, the SMM saw a member of the armed formations (wearing an armband with "JCCC" written on it) near the southern edge of the disengagement area near Zolote.

On the evening of 16 March, the SMM camera 2km east of Bohdanivka (government-controlled, 41km south-west of Donetsk), recorded two projectiles in flight at an assessed range of 2-4km east-south-east, assessed as inside the **disengagement area near Petrivske**. The following morning, while positioned about 700m north-west of Petrivske and about 2km east of Bohdanivka, the SMM heard 27 shots of small-arms fire at a range of 1-2km south and ten bursts of small-arms fire at a range of 3-4km east-south-east, respectively, assessed as inside the disengagement area. It also heard about 50 bursts and shots of small-arms fire and an undetermined explosion, assessed as outside the disengagement area but within 5km of its periphery.

Withdrawal of weapons

The SMM continued to monitor the withdrawal of weapons in implementation of the Memorandum and the Package of Measures and its Addendum.

The Mission saw 18 weapons beyond withdrawal lines but outside of designated storage sites on both sides of the contact line in Donetsk region (for further details, see the table below).

Weapons storage sites

At a permanent storage site in a non-government-controlled area of Luhansk region 17 March

The SMM noted that all previously observed weapons continued to be present.

Indications of military and military-type presence in the security zone⁷

The Mission observed armoured combat vehicles, including some within residential areas, on both sides of the contact line (for further details, see the table below).

While flying its mini-UAV about 1.5km south-east of Luhanske (government-controlled, 59km north-east of Donetsk), the SMM saw a black non-SMM UAV (assessed as a deltawing type) flying from west to east about 1.5km south of its UAV.

On 14 March, about 4km east of Sakhanka (non-government-controlled, 97km south of Donetsk), SMM UAVs spotted a new sub-surface bunker in a <u>recently improved trench. In</u> a residential area of Kozatske (non-government-controlled, 86km south of Donetsk) the UAV spotted an armoured personnel carrier (MT-LB). Both (not seen in imagery from 10 March 2020) were in a zone within which deployment of heavy armaments and military equipment is proscribed according to Point 5 of the Memorandum of 19 September 2014.

Presence of mines, unexploded ordnance and mine hazard signs

On 13 March, an SMM mini-UAV again spotted 33 anti-tank mines (TM-62) laid across road H-21 about 150m south-east of the bridge in Shchastia (government-controlled, 20km north of Luhansk), assessed as belonging to the Ukrainian Armed Forces. About 2km northeast of Vesela Hora (non-government-controlled, 16km north of Luhansk), the UAV again spotted 56 anti-tank mines (TM-62 and probable TM-62) laid across the same road and, on 17 March, an SMM patrol saw about 70 anti-tank mines (TM-57 and TM-62 variants) in four groups nearby, all assessed as belonging to the armed formations.⁸

On 17 March, about 300m from a position of the armed formations west of Nyzhnie Lozove (non-government-controlled, 59km north-east of Donetsk), the SMM <u>again</u> saw about 20 anti-tank mines (TM-62) laid across road M-03.

On the same day, at a checkpoint south-east of Marinka (government-controlled, 23km south-west of Donetsk), the SMM saw for the first time unexploded ordnance (UXO), assessed as the tailfin of a round from an anti-tank guided missile system (9P148 *Konkurs*, 135mm), lying on the southern side of troad N-15, unmarked, which is regularly used by civilians.

About 1.5km south-east of Pyshchevyk (government-controlled, 84km south of Donetsk), the SMM saw for the first time seven mine hazard signs with warnings and instructions concerning encountering mines and UXO (written on them in Cyrillic), attached to trees along a 2km span of the road leading to Verkhnoshyrokivske (formerly Oktiabr, non-government-controlled, 85km south of Donetsk).

Preventative measures against COVID-19 outbreak at entry-exit checkpoints

The SMM <u>continued</u> to see officers of the Border Guard Service of Ukraine wearing protective equipment and measuring the body temperature of civilians at EECPs, and also continued to see members of the armed formations wearing similar equipment and measuring body temperatures of civilians at the checkpoint south of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge. At a checkpoint near Kreminets (non-government-controlled, 16km south-west of Donetsk), the SMM saw for the first time two members of the armed formations wearing medical masks and measuring the body temperatures of civilians.

SMM facilitation of demining activities and repairs to critical civilian infrastructure

The SMM facilitated and monitored adherence to localized ceasefires to facilitate maintenance to power lines near Shchastia and Slovianoserbsk (non-government-controlled, 28km north-west of Luhansk) and demining activities near Krasnyi Yar (non-government-controlled, 12km north-east of Luhansk), along the bank of the Sieverskyi Donets river.

The SMM continued to facilitate the operation of the Donetsk Filtration Station (DFS) (15km north of Donetsk) and to monitor the security situation near the pumping station close to Vasylivka (non-government-controlled, 20km north of Donetsk). While positioned near both facilities, the SMM heard a total of 20 ceasefire violations (including ten explosions) - some assessed as within a 5km radius from the DFS and and other within a 5km radius from the pumping station.

Border areas outside government control

While at a pedestrian border crossing point near Novoborovytsi (79km south of Luhansk) for about 30 minutes, the SMM saw a man (in his fifties) exiting Ukraine.

About ten minutes after its arrival at a border crossing point near Dovzhanske (84km southeast of Luhansk) a member of the armed formations told the SMM to leave the area. While present the SMM saw no traffic in either direction.*

Gathering in Kyiv concerning recent developments related to certain areas of Donetsk and Luhansk region

On 17 March, the SMM saw about 300 people (mostly men, 20-50 years old) in front of the Parliament building in Kyiv, holding signs and speaking about recent political developments pertinent to certain areas of Donetsk and Luhansk regions. The Mission saw that some were carrying flags of the National Corps, *Svoboda* party, and Democratic Axe. About 400 law enforcement officers were present to secure the gathering, which ended without incident.

SMM monitors security situation in south-east of Kherson region

On 15 March, the SMM observed calm situations at the checkpoint between Chonhar (163km south-east of Kherson) and Crimea, and along the Sea of Azov coast.

The Mission continued monitoring in Odessa, Lviv, Ivano-Frankivsk, Kharkiv, Dnipro and Chernivtsi.

*Restrictions of the SMM's freedom of movement or other impediments to fulfilment of its mandate

The SMM's monitoring and freedom of movement are restricted by security hazards and threats, including risks posed by mines, UXO and other impediments – which vary from day to day. The SMM's mandate provides for safe and secure access throughout Ukraine. All signatories of the Package of Measures have agreed on the need for this safe and secure access, that restriction of the SMM's freedom of movement constitutes a violation, and on the need for rapid response to these violations. They have also agreed that the JCCC should contribute to such response and co-ordinate mine clearance. Nonetheless, the armed formations in parts of Donetsk and Luhansk regions frequently deny the SMM access to areas adjacent to Ukraine's border outside control of the

Government (for example, see below). The SMM's operations in Donetsk and Luhansk regions remain restricted following the fatal incident of 23 April 2017 near Pryshyb; these restrictions continued to limit the Mission's observations.

Denial of access:

- At a checkpoint north of Zaichenko (non-government-controlled, 93km south of Donetsk), two armed members of the armed formations <u>again</u> denied the SMM passage through it, citing a "high-level visit in the area."
- At a checkpoint north of Shevchenko (non-government-controlled, 82km south of Donetsk), an armed member of the armed formations denied the SMM passage to Porokhnia (non-government-controlled, 85km south of Donetsk), citing "orders from superiors."
- About 1km north of Korsun (non-government-controlled, 31km north-east of Donetsk) on road M-04, the SMM was stopped by two members of the armed formations (one armed) who redirected it to another road citing "training activities" and the "security of civilians." The SMM saw that other vehicles were being redirected to the same road.
- At a border crossing point near Dovzhanske (non-government-controlled, 84km south-east of Luhansk), a member of the armed formations told the SMM to leave the area.

Regular restrictions related to disengagement areas and mines/UXO:

- The sides continued to deny the SMM full access, as well as the ability to travel certain roads previously identified as important for effective monitoring by the Mission and for civilians' movement, through failure to conduct comprehensive clearance of mines, UXO and other obstacles.

Delay:

- At a checkpoint west of Verkhnoshyrokivske (formerly Oktiabr, non-government-controlled, 85km south of Donetsk), two members of the armed formations (one armed) allowed the SMM to proceed only after about 25 minutes of waiting.
- At a checkpoint in Horlivka (non-government-controlled, 39km north-east of Donetsk), a member of the armed formations allowed the SMM to proceed only about 25 minutes of waiting.

Other impediments:

- On the night between 16 and 17 March, an SMM long-range UAV experienced GPS signal interference, assessed as caused by probable jamming, while flying over areas between Kostiantynivka (government-controlled, 60km north of Donetsk) and Zolote (government-controlled, 60km west of Luhansk).⁹
- An SMM mid-range UAV <u>again</u> experienced signal interference, assessed as caused by probable jamming, while flying over areas near Lebedynske (government-controlled, 99km south of Donetsk).
- In Sofiivka (formerly Karlo-Marksove, non-government-controlled, 40km northeast of Donetsk) two armed members of the armed formations behaved in an aggressive way towards members of an SMM patrol. They also pointed a weapon at the patrol members (see above).

- The SMM saw two objects dropped by parachutes land close to its positions close to the disengagement area near Petrivske (non-government-controlled, 41km south of Donetsk) (see above).


