


Daily Report 132/2020

4 June 2020¹

Summary

- Compared with the previous reporting period, the SMM recorded more ceasefire violations in Donetsk region and recorded no ceasefire violations in Luhansk region.
- Members of the armed formations continued to deny the SMM passage at checkpoints along official crossing routes in Donetsk and Luhansk regions.*
- The Mission continued monitoring all three disengagement areas and saw damage caused by small-arms fire to its camera in Petrivske.
- The Mission facilitated and monitored adherence to localised ceasefires to enable vegetation clearance, inspection and maintenance of railway tracks near Vilkhove, and to enable the operation of the Donetsk Filtration Station.
- The Mission continued following up on measures taken amid the COVID-19 outbreak, including at entry-exit checkpoints and checkpoints in Donetsk and Luhansk regions.
- The SMM's freedom of movement continued to be restricted.*

Ceasefire violations²





In Donetsk region, the SMM recorded more ceasefire violations, including more explosions (about 85), compared with the <u>previous reporting period</u> (21 explosions). The majority of ceasefire violations, including the majority of explosions, were recorded in areas near the disengagement area close to Petrivske (non-government-controlled, 41km south of Donetsk) (see below) and at northerly directions of Shyrokyne (government-controlled, 100km south of Donetsk).

In Luhansk region, the SMM recorded no ceasefire violations.

Damage caused by small-arms fire to SMM camera in Petrivske

On 3 June, at the SMM camera site in Petrivske, the Mission saw that both boxes housing the camera system, consisting of a daylight and a thermal camera, had sustained damage assessed as caused by small-arms fire. The Mission saw holes in the east-facing back panels of the box housing the thermal camera. It also saw a hole in the east-facing back panel of the box housing the daytime camera, which was lying on the ground nearby with a corner missing as a result of a bullet impact. The Mission saw several shards of glass, assessed as pieces of camera lenses, on the ground near the camera mast. The SMM assessed that all bullets had been fired from a west-north-westerly direction.

The Mission had lost the video feed from the camera system at about 14:30 on 2 June. Footage from a security camera installed at the site recorded the sound of shots, immediately after which the SMM lost the video feed from both cameras (see <u>SMM Spot Report 29/2020</u>).

Members of the armed formations continued to deny the SMM passage at checkpoints along the contact line in Donetsk and Luhansk regions

Members of the armed formations continued to deny the SMM passage at checkpoints in both Donetsk and Luhansk regions along official crossing routes. These restrictions constitute an impediment to the implementation of the Mission's mandate.⁵

In Donetsk region, at a checkpoint north of Horlivka (non-government-controlled, 39km north-east of Donetsk), a member of the armed formations <u>again</u> denied the SMM passage towards non-government-controlled areas, referring to restrictions due to COVID-19. The SMM again saw a metal barrier and spikes laid across the road, as well as a mine hazard sign.*

In Luhansk region, at a checkpoint south of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge (15km northeast of Luhansk), two members of the armed formations <u>again</u> denied the SMM passage towards non-government-controlled areas, referring to the closure of the checkpoint due to COVID-19.*

Disengagement areas near Stanytsia Luhanska, Zolote and Petrivske⁶

On 2 June, outside the **disengagement area near Stanytsia Luhanska** (government-controlled, 16km north-east of Luhansk), an SMM mini-unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV) spotted five persons assessed as Ukrainian Armed Forces personnel conducting works at an underground bunker position and trenches close to the area's northern edge. Nearby, the UAV also spotted a probable armoured personnel carrier (BTR-3E). Near the Prince Ihor monument, about 1km south-east of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge, it spotted three anti-aircraft guns (one ZU-23, 23mm and two probable ZPU-1, 14.5mm) (see the table below for additional details and SMM Daily Reports of 16 April 2020 and 12 May 2020 for previous observations).

On 3 June, inside the disengagement area, the SMM saw four members of the armed formations (wearing armbands with "JCCC" written on them) at their checkpoint south of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge.

On 3 June, the Mission saw six members of the armed formations (wearing armbands with "JCCC" written on them) near the southern edge of the **disengagement area near Zolote** (government-controlled, 60km west of Luhansk) – two of whom were walking inside the area along road T-1316 up to about 350m north of its southern edge and later returned to their checkpoint just south of the area.

On the same day, outside the disengagement area (about 450m south of it), the SMM saw workers, measuring the ground with special equipment on a tripod and four de-miners with metal detectors accompanied by a member of the armed formations (wearing an armband with "JCCC" written on it) walking along road T-1316. The same armed formations member told the Mission that the workers had been measuring the area for possible future construction works.

On the evening of 2 June, inside the **disengagement area near Petrivske**, an SMM long-range UAV spotted two persons within a former position of the armed formations near the area's south-eastern corner.

On the same evening, the SMM camera near Bohdanivka (government-controlled, 41km south-west of Donetsk) recorded 26 projectiles in flight and 26 subsequent airbursts, as well as 40 additional airbursts, all at an assessed range of 3-5km south-east and assessed as outside the disengagement area but within 5km of its periphery.

On 3 June, while positioned 2km north of Petrivske, the SMM heard four undetermined explosions and 130 shots and bursts of small-arms and heavy-machine-gun fire, all at an assessed range of 4-5km south. (See also above for damage to the SMM camera in Petrivske caused by small-arms fire.) On the same day, while positioned about 2km east of Bohdanivka, the Mission heard and saw an explosion at an assessed range of 5-6km east-south-east, assessed as an impact, as well as heard nine bursts of heavy-machine-gun fire. All of these ceasefire violations were assessed as outside the disengagement area but within 5km of its periphery.⁷

Withdrawal of weapons

The SMM continued to monitor the withdrawal of weapons in implementation of the Memorandum and the Package of Measures and its Addendum.

Beyond withdrawal lines but outside designated storage sites, the SMM observed self-propelled howitzers at a railway station in a government-controlled area of Donetsk region, as well as self-propelled howitzers and tanks in a training area in non-government-controlled Luhansk region (for further details, see the tables below).

Indications of military and military-type presence inside the security zone⁸

The SMM observed armoured combat vehicles in government-controlled areas of Donetsk and Luhansk regions, as well as anti-aircraft guns in non-government-controlled areas of Luhansk region (for further details, see the table below).

Presence of mines near government-controlled Vodiane

On 2 June, an SMM mid-range UAV again spotted about 120 anti-tank mines, part of a larger minefield east of Vodiane (government-controlled, 94km south of Donetsk), assessed as belonging to the Ukrainian Armed Forces (for previous observations in the area, see SMM Daily Report 22 May 2020).

SMM facilitation of operation of critical civilian infrastructure

The SMM facilitated and monitored adherence to localised ceasefires to enable vegetation clearance, inspection and maintenance of railway tracks near Vilkhove (government-controlled, 22km north-east of Luhansk).

The SMM continued to facilitate the operation of the Donetsk Filtration Station (DFS) (15km north of Donetsk). While positioned at two locations near the DFS, the Mission heard two undetermined explosions, as well as shots of small-arms fire, all assessed as within a 5km radius of the station.

Measures taken at entry-exit checkpoints and corresponding checkpoints amid COVID-19 outbreak

In Donetsk region, the SMM noted that the entry-exit checkpoint (EECP) near Hnutove (government-controlled, 90km south of Donetsk) and the checkpoint of the armed formations near Horlivka remained closed.*

In Luhansk region, the SMM saw that the EECP in Stanytsia Luhanska and its corresponding checkpoint of the armed formations south of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge remained closed.*

Near the EECP in Stanytsia Luhanska, the SMM observed a group of eight civilians (four women of mixed ages, two men in their fifties and seventies, and two children aged one

and 11), who expressed concerns to the SMM about not being able to return to their homes in non-government-controlled areas of Luhansk region due to the EECP's temporary closure.

The Mission continued monitoring in Kherson, Dnipro, Odessa, Lviv, Ivano-Frankivsk, Kharkiv, Chernivtsi and Kyiv.

*Restrictions of the SMM's freedom of movement or other impediments to fulfilment of its mandate

The SMM's monitoring and freedom of movement are restricted by security hazards and threats, including risks posed by mines and unexploded ordnance (UXO) and other impediments – which vary from day to day. The SMM's mandate provides for safe and secure access throughout Ukraine. All signatories of the Package of Measures have agreed on the need for this safe and secure access, that restriction of the SMM's freedom of movement constitutes a violation, and on the need for rapid response to these violations. They have also agreed that the Joint Centre for Control and Co-ordination (JCCC) should contribute to such response and co-ordinate mine clearance. Nonetheless, the armed formations in parts of Donetsk and Luhansk regions frequently deny the SMM access to areas adjacent to Ukraine's border outside control of the Government (for example, see SMM Daily Report 1 June 2020). The SMM's operations in Donetsk and Luhansk regions remain restricted following the fatal incident of 23 April 2017 near Pryshyb; these restrictions continued to limit the Mission's observations.

Denial of access:

- At a checkpoint north of Horlivka (non-government-controlled, 39km north-east of Donetsk), an armed member of the armed formations <u>again</u> denied the SMM passage towards non-government-controlled areas, referring to restrictions due to COVID-19. The SMM continued to observe the presence of a metal barrier and spikes laid across the road, and of a mine hazard sign.
- At a checkpoint south of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge (15km north-east of Luhansk), a member of the armed formations <u>again</u> denied the SMM passage towards non-government-controlled areas, referring to the closure of the checkpoint due to COVID-19.

Regular restrictions related to disengagement areas and mines/unexploded ordnance (UXO):

- The sides continued to deny the SMM full access, as well as the ability to travel certain roads previously identified as important for effective monitoring by the Mission and for civilians' movement, through failure to conduct comprehensive clearance of mines, UXO and other obstacles.

Other impediments:

On the evening of 2 June, an SMM long-range UAV experienced GPS signal interference, assessed as probable jamming, while flying over areas between Novozarivka (non-government-controlled, 47km south-east of Donetsk) and Stepanivka (government-controlled, 54km north of Donetsk).

On 3 June, personnel at a hospital in Kadiivka (formerly Stakhanov, non-government-controlled, 50km west of Luhansk) declined to provide information to the SMM regarding an alleged civilian casualty, stating the need for permission from those in control.



¹¹ The table only includes ceasefire violations directly observed by the SMM patrols or recorded by the SMM cameras and it may include those also assessed to be live-fire exercises, controlled detonations, etc. Details provided – in terms of distance, direction, weapons-type, etc. – are based on assessments provided by monitors on the ground and technical monitoring officers, and are not always necessarily precise. When information is not known (indicated with an "N/K"), the SMM was unable to ascertain such information due to distance, weather conditions technical limitations and/or other considerations. Ceasefire violations recorded by more than one patrol/camera and assessed to be the same are entered only once.

This map of eastern Ukraine is meant for illustrative purposes and indicates locations mentioned in the report, as well as those where the SMM has offices (monitoring teams, patrol hubs, and forward patrol bases) in Donetsk and Luhansk regions. (In red: a forward patrol base from which SMM staff has temporarily relocated based on recommendations of security experts from participating States as well as SMM security considerations. The SMM uses the premises during daylight hours and patrols in this settlement during daylight hours, as well).
