
# Daily Report 139/2020

12 June 2020<sup>1</sup>

#### **Summary**

- Compared with the previous reporting period, the SMM recorded more ceasefire violations in Donetsk region and fewer in Luhansk region.
- Members of the armed formations continued to deny the SMM passage at a checkpoint along official crossing routes in Luhansk region.\*
- The SMM continued monitoring all three disengagement areas: it observed people inside the disengagement areas near Zolote and Petrivske.
- The SMM saw weapons in violation of the withdrawal lines in non-government-controlled areas of Donetsk and Luhansk regions.
- The SMM facilitated and monitored adherence to localised ceasefires to enable vegetation clearance, inspection and maintenance of railway tracks near Vilkhove and the operation of the Donetsk Filtration Station.
- The Mission saw that the entry-exit checkpoints (EECP) in Stanytsia Luhanska and Marinka were temporarily open but that the corresponding checkpoints of the armed formations remained closed. At both EECPs, the Mission observed people and cars queuing to cross the contact line.
- The SMM's freedom of movement continued to be restricted.\*

#### Ceasefire violations<sup>2</sup>





# Map of recorded ceasefire violations



In Donetsk region, the SMM recorded more ceasefire violations, including more explosions (about 210), compared with the <u>previous reporting period</u> (about 60 explosions). The majority of the ceasefire violations were recorded in areas east and west of Svitlodarsk (government-controlled, 57km north-east of Donetsk), including about 200 explosions of artillery rounds.

In Luhansk region, the SMM recorded fewer ceasefire violations, including fewer explosions (about 130), compared with the <u>previous reporting period</u> (about 300 explosions). All the ceasefire violations, including all the explosions, were recorded in areas north-east of Popasna (government-controlled, 69km west of Luhansk) and south-west of Kriakivka (government-controlled, 38km north-west of Luhansk).

# Members of the armed formations continued to deny the SMM passage at checkpoints along the contact line

Members of the armed formations continued to deny the SMM passage at checkpoints along official crossing routes. These restrictions constitute an impediment to the implementation of the Mission's mandate.<sup>5</sup>

In Luhansk region, at a checkpoint south of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge (15km north-east of Luhansk), a member of the armed formations <u>again</u> denied the SMM passage towards non-government-controlled areas, referring to the closure of the checkpoint due to COVID-19.\*

#### Disengagement areas near Stanytsia Luhanska, Zolote and Petrivske<sup>6</sup>

On 11 June, inside the **disengagement area near Stanytsia Luhanska** (government-controlled, 16km north-east of Luhansk), the SMM saw a senior member of the armed formations and at least four other members of the armed formations wearing armbands with "JCCC" written on them near their checkpoint south of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge. The Mission also saw two workers and a member of the armed formations inspecting and measuring the area near the booths about 20-30m south of said checkpoint.

On the evening of 9 June, inside the **disengagement area near Zolote** (government-controlled, 60km west of Luhansk), an SMM long-range unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV) spotted a person near a former position of the Ukrainian Armed Forces about 200m south of the area's northern edge.

On 11 June, on the southern edge of the disengagement area near Zolote, the Mission saw nine members of the armed formations (all wearing armbands with "JCCC" written on them), four of whom were walking inside the area along road T-1316 up to about 350m north of its southern edge and back.

Throughout the same day, while positioned at two locations near the disengagement area, the Mission observed a calm situation.

On the evening of 9 June, inside the **disengagement area near Petrivske** (non-government-controlled, 41km south of Donetsk), an SMM long-range UAV spotted two people near a former position of the armed formations near the area's south-eastern corner.

On the same evening, outside the disengagement area, the UAV again spotted nine anti-tank mines, assessed as part of a larger minefield belonging to the Ukrainian Armed Forces, north of a road between Bohdanivka (government-controlled, 41km south-west of Donetsk) and Viktorivka (non-government-controlled, 42km south-west of Donetsk) (for previous observations, see SMM Daily Report 6 June 2020).

On 11 June, also outside the disengagement area near Petrivske, while positioned about 2km east of Bohdanivka, the SMM saw an infantry fighting vehicle (BMP-2) about 300m north of the area's north-western corner, moving south-west.

Throughout the same day, while positioned at three locations near the area, the Mission observed a calm situation.

#### Withdrawal of weapons

The SMM continued to monitor the withdrawal of weapons as part of the implementation of the Memorandum and the Package of Measures and its Addendum.

The Mission observed 23 weapons in violation of withdrawal lines in non-government-controlled areas of Donetsk and Luhansk regions.

Beyond withdrawal lines but outside designated storage areas, the SMM observed ten weapons, including at a railway station in a government-controlled area of Donetsk region, as well as 44 weapons in training areas in non-government-controlled areas of both Donetsk and Luhansk regions (for further details, see the tables below).

### Indications of military and military-type presence inside the security zone<sup>7</sup>

The SMM observed two armoured combat vehicles in a government-controlled area of Donetsk region (for further details, see the table below).

#### Presence of mines near Marinka and near Popasna

On 10 June, an SMM mini-UAV again spotted 25 anti-tank mines about 1.8km east-south-east of the entry-exit checkpoint (EECP) near Marinka (government-controlled, 23km south-west of Donetsk), placed on the eastern and western sides of the junction of a local road with road H-15 (for previous observations in the area, see <a href="SMM Daily Report 14 March 2020">SMM Daily Report 14 March 2020</a>).

About 10m north of road T-0504, between Popasna and Molodizhne (non-government-controlled, 63km west of Luhansk), the SMM again saw an anti-personnel mine (MON-200).

#### SMM facilitation of repairs to and operation of critical civilian infrastructure

The SMM facilitated and monitored adherence to localised ceasefires to enable vegetation clearance, inspection, and maintenance of railway tracks near Vilkhove (government-controlled, 22km north-east of Luhansk).

The Mission continued to facilitate the operation of the Donetsk Filtration Station (DFS) (15km north of Donetsk). While positioned at two locations near the DFS, the SMM heard and saw two explosions, assessed as impacts of undetermined weapons, and heard an undetermined explosion, as well as shots and bursts of small-arms fire, all assessed as within a 5km radius of the station.

# Measures taken at entry-exit checkpoints and corresponding checkpoints amid COVID-19 outbreak

On 11 June, in Donetsk region, the Mission saw that the EECP near Marinka was open between 11:00 and 14:00 and that about eight people (mixed genders and ages, including two children) and about ten cars were queuing to travel toward non-government-controlled areas. The SMM saw personnel from two international organizations near the EECP. The Mission also saw three women leaving the EECP and walking north-west in the direction of Kurakhove (government-controlled, 40km west of Donetsk). A police officer told the SMM that they were from a group of five women who had all been denied entry into non-government-controlled areas at a checkpoint of the armed formations near Oleksandrivka (non-government-controlled, 20km south-west of Donetsk) and had returned to the EECP on 10 June (for previous observations at the EECP, see SMM Daily Report 11 June 2020).

On the morning of 11 June, west of the aforementioned checkpoint of the armed formations near Oleksandrivka, the SMM saw a woman (in her sixties) lying on the asphalt near a road barrier. She told the Mission that she had arrived there on the morning of 10 June and had remained near the checkpoint overnight after members of the armed formations denied her passage toward non-government-controlled areas (she said she could not walk back or afford transportation). She also said that four other women had arrived with her at the checkpoint on the morning of 10 June, one of whom had returned to government-controlled areas immediately after being denied passage, while the remaining three had returned to the EECP near Marinka on the evening of the same day.

The Mission saw that the corresponding checkpoint of the armed formations east of Kreminets (non-government-controlled, 16km south-west of Donetsk) remained closed.\* Throughout the day, the SMM saw a total of 14 civilians (mixed genders and ages) in seven cars approaching the checkpoint and then returning to non-government-controlled areas after being denied passage toward government-controlled areas.

In Luhansk region, the SMM saw that the EECP in Stanytsia Luhanska was open between 11:00 and 11:30, and that about 30 people (mixed genders and ages) were queuing at the EECP to travel toward non-government-controlled areas. While there, the SMM also saw two women (in their seventies) and a man (in his sixties) crossing and subsequently returning to government-controlled areas after being denied passage into non-government-controlled areas at the checkpoint of the armed formations south of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge. Throughout the day, the Mission also saw three personnel from an international organization near the EECP.

The Mission noted that the corresponding checkpoint of the armed formations south of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge remained closed.\*

#### Border areas outside government control

On 9 June, aerial imagery available to the SMM revealed the presence of a probable military-type truck on a dirt road about 2.3km south-west of Stepne (72km south-east of Donetsk), about 700m west of the border with the Russian Federation, in an area where there are no border crossing facilities (for previous observations in the areas, see <a href="SMM Daily Report 8 June 2020">SMM Daily Report 8 June 2020</a>).

The Mission continued monitoring in Kherson, Dnipro, Odessa, Lviv, Ivano-Frankivsk, Kharkiv, Chernivtsi and Kyiv.

# \*Restrictions of the SMM's freedom of movement or other impediments to fulfilment of its mandate

The SMM's monitoring and freedom of movement are restricted by security hazards and threats, including risks posed by mines and unexploded ordnance (UXO) and other impediments – which vary from day to day. The SMM's mandate provides for safe and secure access throughout Ukraine. All signatories of the Package of Measures have agreed on the need for this safe and secure access, that restriction of the SMM's freedom of movement constitutes a violation, and on the need for rapid response to these violations. They have also agreed that the Joint Centre for Control and Coordination (JCCC) should contribute to such response and co-ordinate mine clearance. Nonetheless, the armed formations in parts of Donetsk and Luhansk regions frequently deny the SMM access to areas adjacent to Ukraine's border outside control of the Government (for example, see SMM Daily Report 10 June). The SMM's operations in Donetsk and Luhansk regions remain restricted following the fatal incident of 23 April 2017 near Pryshyb; these restrictions continued to limit the Mission's observations.

#### Denial of access:

- At a checkpoint south of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge (15km north-east of Luhansk), a member of the armed formations <u>again</u> denied the SMM passage towards non-government-controlled areas, referring to the closure of the checkpoint due to COVID-19.

### Delay:

- When traveling between checkpoints of the armed formations near non-government-controlled Oleksandrivka (20km south-west of Donetsk) and Kreminets (16km south-west of Donetsk), an SMM patrol was allowed passage through the latter only after about 55 and 45 minutes, respectively, and on one occasion, only after members of the armed formations had disinfected the SMM vehicles.

Regular restrictions related to disengagement areas and mines/unexploded ordnance (UXO):

- The sides continued to deny the SMM full access, as well as the ability to travel on certain roads previously identified as important for effective monitoring by the Mission and for civilians' movement, through failure to conduct comprehensive clearance of mines, UXO and other obstacles.

# Other impediments:

- On the evening of 9 June, an SMM long-range UAV experienced GPS signal interference, assessed as probable jamming, while flying over areas between non-

government-controlled Seleznivka (43km south-west of Luhansk) and Antratsyt (55km south-west of Luhansk).  $^{8}\,$


