
Daily Report 192/2021

18 August 2021¹

Summary

- In Donetsk region, the SMM recorded 165 ceasefire violations, including three explosions. In the previous reporting period, it recorded 139 ceasefire violations in the region.
- In Luhansk region, the Mission recorded five ceasefire violations. In the previous reporting period, it recorded 445 ceasefire violations.
- The SMM continued monitoring the disengagement areas near Stanytsia Luhanska, Zolote and Petrivske. It recorded ceasefire violations close to the disengagement area near Zolote and inside the disengagement area near Petrivske.
- The Mission facilitated and monitored adherence to localized ceasefires to enable the operation and repairs to critical civilian infrastructure.
- The SMM continued following up on the situation of civilians, including at four entry-exit checkpoints and three corresponding checkpoints of the armed formations in Donetsk and Luhansk regions.
- The SMM monitored a gathering in Kyiv.
- The Mission's freedom of movement continued to be restricted.*





Map of recorded ceasefire violations



In Donetsk region, the SMM recorded 165 ceasefire violations, including three explosions (two undetermined and one airburst). The majority of ceasefire violations occurred at northerly directions of Shyrokyne (government-controlled, 100km south of Donetsk) and inside the disengagement area near Petrivske (non-government-controlled, 41km south of Donetsk). (See below.) In the <u>previous reporting period</u>, the Mission recorded 139 ceasefire violations.

In Luhansk region, the SMM recorded five ceasefire violations. All ceasefire violations occurred in an area north of the disengagement area near Zolote (government-controlled, 60km west of Luhansk). (See below.) In the <u>previous reporting period</u>, the Mission recorded 445 ceasefire violations, the majority of which also occurred near the aforementioned disengagement area.

Following agreement reached at the meeting of the Trilateral Contact Group on 22 July 2020 regarding additional measures to strengthen the ceasefire, from 00:01 on 27 July 2020 until the end of the reporting period, the SMM has recorded at least 50,551 ceasefire violations in both Donetsk and Luhansk regions (including 14,251 explosions, 9,795 projectiles in flight, 265 muzzle flashes, 195 illumination flares and at least 26,045 bursts and shots).

Disengagement areas near Stanytsia Luhanska, Zolote and Petrivske⁵

Inside the **disengagement area near Stanytsia Luhanska** (government-controlled, 16km north-east of Luhansk), the SMM saw three members of the armed formations (wearing armbands with "JCCC" written on them) south of the repaired span of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge (15km north-east of Luhansk).

Inside the disengagement area, about 400m south of its northern edge, the Mission observed two men (ages unknown) cutting grass on the eastern edge of road T-1316.

On the evening of 16 August, the SMM camera in Zolote recorded five projectiles in flight at an assessed range of 1-3km east and assessed as outside the **disengagement area near Zolote** but within 5km of its periphery.

During the day on 17 August, near the checkpoint of the armed formations south of the area, the Mission saw two members of the armed formations (wearing armbands with "JCCC" written on them).

On the night of 16-17 August, the SMM camera about 2km east of Bohdanivka (government-controlled, 41km south-west of Donetsk) recorded 70 projectiles in flight and three illumination flares at an assessed range of 1-4km east-south-east and south-east, assessed as inside the **disengagement area near Petrivske**, as well as one projectile in flight at an assessed range of 2-4km south-east, unable to be assessed as inside or outside the disengagement area.

During the day on 17 August, while positioned at four locations near the area, the Mission observed a calm situation.

Withdrawal of weapons

The SMM continued to monitor the withdrawal of weapons in implementation of the Memorandum and the Package of Measures and its Addendum.

In violation of withdrawal lines, in non-government-controlled areas of Donetsk region, the Mission observed six multiple launch rocket systems (three probable), six tanks and six mortars, all inside and near a training area in a zone within which deployment of heavy armaments and military equipment is further proscribed according to Point 5 of the Memorandum of 19 September 2014.

Beyond withdrawal lines but outside designated storage sites, the SMM saw 27 tanks, 12 howitzers, six anti-tank guns, one mortar and ten surface-to-air missile systems, in two training areas in non-government-controlled areas of Donetsk and Luhansk regions. Indication of military and military-type presence in the security zone

The SMM saw 17 armoured combat vehicles on both sides of the contact line in Donetsk region, including in a training area in a non-government-controlled area in a zone within which deployment of heavy armaments and military equipment is proscribed according to Point 5 of the Memorandum of 19 September 2014. (For further information, see the table below.)

While positioned 1km west of the north-western edge of Toshkivka (government-controlled, 60km north-west of Luhansk), the Mission observed two Ukrainian Armed Forces soldiers standing near a civilian vehicle parked on the eastern edge of road P-66. The SMM saw that one of the Ukrainian Armed Forces soldier was holding an object assessed as a control panel for an UAV. Then, the Mission saw a non-SMM mini-UAV flying and landing about 10m and 40m east, respectively, of the SMM's position, despite the ban on the operation of any aerial vehicles included in the 22 July 2020 Trilateral Contact Group decision regarding additional measures to strengthen the ceasefire. Subsequently, the Mission saw the same Ukrainian Armed Forces soldier holding the control panel collect the UAV and leave the area (with the other Ukrainian Armed Forces soldier) in the aforementioned vehicle.

SMM facilitation of the operation and repairs of critical civilian infrastructure

The Mission continued to facilitate the operation of the Donetsk Filtration Station (DFS) (15km north of Donetsk).

The SMM also monitored the security situation near the pumping station near Vasylivka (non-government-controlled, 20km north of Donetsk), and adherence to localized ceasefires to enable repairs to the phenol sludge reservoir near government-controlled Nelipivka (40km north of Donetsk), power lines in and near Vodiane (government-controlled, 94km south of Donetsk) and to railway tracks near Yasne (non-government-controlled, 30km south-west of Donetsk).

Situation at entry-exit checkpoints and corresponding checkpoints

In Donetsk region, the SMM observed that the entry-exit checkpoint (EECP) near Novotroitske (government-controlled, 36km south-west of Donetsk) was open, but did not observe any traffic passing through.

In Luhansk region, the Mission observed that the EECP near Stanytsia Luhanska and the corresponding checkpoint of the armed formations south of Stanytsia Luhanska bridge were open, with people queueing to travel in both directions.

The SMM noted that the EECPs near Zolote and Shchastia (government-controlled, 20km north of Luhansk) were open, but that the corresponding checkpoints of the armed formations south of the disengagement area near Zolote, and 3km south-east of the bridge in Shchastia, were closed.

The Mission observed a gathering in Kyiv

On 17 August, at the Heroes of the Heavenly Hundred Alley in Kyiv, the SMM monitored a gathering of about 50 people (mostly men, between their twenties and forties), expressing their criticism about the presence of a set of installations depicting specific historical periods of Ukraine. It also saw about 40 law enforcement officers nearby. The Mission observed some of the participants dismantling the installations. It also saw a physical altercation between them and law enforcement officers, who detained four people.

Later, at 30 Moskovska Street, the SMM also observed another gathering of about 60 people (mostly men, between their twenties and fifties) expressing support for the detained participants at the previous gathering.

The SMM continued monitoring in Kherson, Odessa, Lviv, Ivano-Frankivsk, Kharkiv, Dnipro and Chernivtsi.

*Restrictions of the SMM's freedom of movement or other impediments to fulfilment of its mandate

The SMM's monitoring and freedom of movement are restricted by security hazards and threats, including risks posed by mines, unexploded ordnance (UXO) and other impediments — which vary from day to day. The SMM's mandate provides for safe and secure access throughout Ukraine. All signatories of the Minsk agreements have agreed on the need for this safe and secure access, that restriction of the SMM's freedom of movement constitutes a violation, and on the need for rapid response to these violations. They have also agreed that the Joint Centre for Control and Coordination (JCCC) should contribute to such response and co-ordinate mine clearance. Nonetheless, the armed formations in parts of Donetsk and Luhansk regions frequently deny the SMM access to areas adjacent to Ukraine's border outside control of the government (for example, see SMM Daily Report of 13 August 2021). The SMM's operations in Donetsk and Luhansk regions remain restricted following the fatal incident of 23 April 2017 near Pryshyb; these restrictions continued to limit the Mission's observations.

Regular restrictions related to disengagement areas and mines/UXO:

- The sides continued to deny the SMM full access, as well as the ability to travel certain roads previously identified as important for effective monitoring by the Mission and for civilians'

movement, through failure to conduct comprehensive clearance of mines, UXO and other obstacles.

Other impediments:6

- Staff at a school in Perevalsk (non-government-controlled, 38km west of Luhansk) refused to share information on allegations of shelling referring the Mission to those in control.
- An SMM mini-UAV experienced GPS signal interference, assessed as caused by probable jamming, during one flight over areas near Molodizhne (non-government-controlled, 63km west of Luhansk).



When information is not known (indicated with an "N/K"), the SMM was unable to ascertain such information due to distance, weather conditions technical limitations and/or other considerations. Ceasefire violations recorded by more than one patrol/camera and assessed to be the same are entered only once.

The SMM is deployed to ten locations throughout Ukraine – Kherson, Odessa, Lviv, Ivano-Frankivsk, Kharkiv, Donetsk, Dnipro, Chernivtsi, Luhansk and Kyiv – as per Permanent Council Decision 1117 of 21 March 2014. This map of eastern Ukraine is meant for illustrative purposes and indicates locations mentioned in the report, as well as those where the SMM has offices (monitoring teams, patrol hubs and forward patrol bases) in Donetsk and Luhansk regions. (In red: a forward patrol base from which SMM staff have temporarily relocated based on recommendations of security experts from participating States, as well as SMM security considerations. The SMM uses the premises during daylight hours and also patrols in this settlement during daylight hours).
