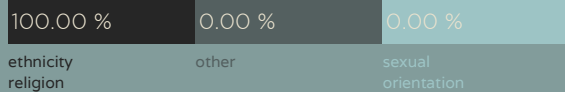

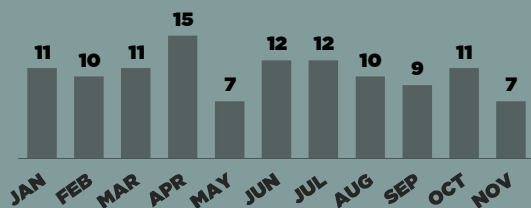

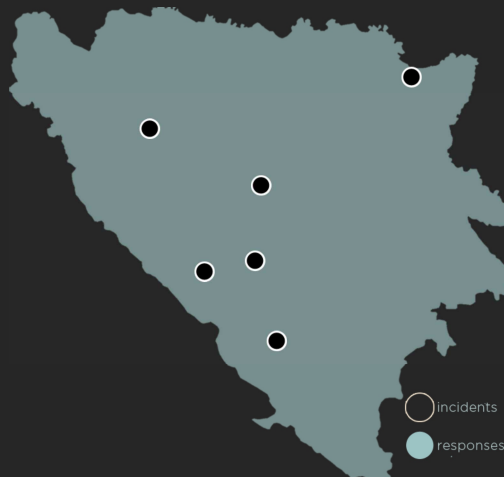

### Highlighted

From 13 to 27 November, in nine locations across BiH, 31 Coalitions against Hate (CaHs) marked the International Day of Tolerance for the fourth consecutive year. The focus of this year's activities was to increase the engagement of young women and men in addressing tolerance-related challenges by organizing discussions with local authorities and young politicians. The discussions were followed by number of cultural events.
