## Statement of the European Union in response to the address by Ambassador Miroslav Lajcak, High Representative and EU Special Representative for Bosnia and Herzegovina

The European Union welcomes Amb. Miroslav Lajcak to the Permanent Council today.

We commend the close cooperation between the OHR/EUSR and the OSCE, in working in areas such as elections, education, human rights, and justice reform.

We reiterate our full support to the HR/EUSR, and his efforts to advance reforms which, especially in the case of police reform, are essential for Bosnia and Herzegovina to move forward. The EU also fully supports the High Representative's recently announced measures, which aim at improving and strengthening the functionality of the institutions of Bosnia and Herzegovina, in accordance with the Dayton Peace Agreement.

We wish the High Representative and his staff every success in their endeavours.
