EU statement on recent incidents in Abkhazia, Georgia

The EU remains seriously concerned about recent developments in the Georgian conflict areas, including the latest incident in Abkhazia on 20 April.

The EU reiterates its firm commitment to the sovereignty, independence, and territorial integrity of Georgia within its internationally recognised borders as reaffirmed in the UNSC resolution 1808 of 15 April 2008.

The EU reconfirms the leading role of the United Nations in Abkhazia, Georgia in negotiations aimed at the peaceful resolution of the conflict. We support the efforts of the United Nations Secretary General and his special representative, with the assistance of the United Nations Secretary General's Group of Friends.

The EU strongly condemns all activities, including threats to use military force, which risk increasing tension, and calls on all parties involved in these incidents to renounce armed or military action and to respect Georgia's sovereignty and territorial integrity.

Regarding the latest incident, the EU welcomes UNOMIG's proposal for a UN-led Joint Fact Finding Group and hopes for consensus on its modalities shortly. We are looking forward to the results of the investigation. We stand ready to contribute to these efforts, including by providing experts for such a Group.
