## Theory of tolerance and non-discrimination and the ways of its practical realization.

Dear Mr. Moderator, your Excellencies, dear colleagues,

I would like to underline importance of Kazakhstan chairmanship in OSCE in integration of Central Asian cultural values into globalizing world.

In a way, the theory of tolerance and non-discrimination as a part of human studies has been created in Central Asia at the eve of the last millennium. To realize their common and mutual features, opening them for the 'other' cultures of the world could help for solution of a number of problems of ethnic, national, regional and interregional characters.
