



STATEMENT BY MS. MIROSLAVA BEHAM, AMBASSADOR OF SERBIA, IN RESPONSE TO THE MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS OF MONTENEGRO, H.E. MILAN ROĆEN, AT THE 683rd MEETING OF THE OSCE PERMANENT COUNCIL
