FACTS MATTER

- On 26-27 July, OSCE Secretary General Thomas Greminger travelled to eastern Ukraine, where he met government officials and saw first-hand the everyday work of the SMM teams in the field.
- Between 23 July and 5 August, the SMM noted a deterioration of the security situation in eastern Ukraine. The number of ceasefire violations on 30 July exceeded the daily average for the week immediately preceding the 1 July recommitment to the ceasefire.
- The SMM continued to observe weapons in violation of agreed withdrawal lines (141 over the two-week period (118 in areas not controlled by the Government)) as well as the close proximity of Armed Forces and armed formations, and the ongoing presence of mines and unexploded ordnance.
- By 5 August, the Mission confirmed that 31 civilians had been killed since the start of the year and another 137 had been injured.
- In addition to threats posed by mines and unexploded ordnance which the sides are obliged to remove - the Mission continued to face restrictions on its movement, in particular in areas not controlled by the Government in southern Donetsk region and along the Ukraine-Russian Federation border in Luhansk
