- Framework: Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action and review session
- Main functions include:
 - Substantive support to the Commission on the Status of Women, UN General Assembly, and ECOSOC
 - Policy research and analysis
- Violence against women is one of the 12 Critical Areas of Concern identified by the Beijing Platform for Action

The United Nations and work to address violence against women since 2006

- Launch of the Secretary-General's in-depth study on violence against women (also known as Ending violence against women: from words to action)
- Comprehensive resolution (A/RES/61/143) adopted by the General Assembly in 2006
- February 2008: launch of the Secretary-General's
 UNiTE to end violence against women campaign

Work of the UNDAW on violence against women since 2006

- Proposed set of global indicators to measure violence against women (currently under consideration by the United Nations Statistical Commission)
- Preparation of a model framework for legislation on violence against women
- Establishment of a coordinated database on violence against women, including preparation of a comprehensive questionnaire to Member States

About the database on violence against women and the questionnaire to Member States

- Information from a variety of sources, including States parties' reports to the human rights treaty bodies, and information from UN entities
- Main source of information for the database will be responses to the questionnaire to Member States

Information requested by the questionnaire

- Information is requested on the following eleven categories of measures:
 - Institutional mechanisms
 - Coordination and collaboration
 - Legal framework
 - Training and capacity-building
 - Policies and programmes
 - Resources
 - Services for women survivors
 - Preventive measures
 - Data and statistics
 - Evaluation
 - Good practices
