United States Mission to the OSCE Response to Belarus

As delivered by Chargé d' Affaires Kyle Scott to the Permanent Council, Vienna January 22, 2009

Madam Chairwoman,

At the Permanent Council meeting on December 18, 2008, the United States made a statement regretting that the government of Belarus had, on December 9, sentenced a human rights defender, Alyaksandr Barazenko, to one year of restricted freedom for participating in an entrepreneurs rally in January of 2008. Following our statement, the distinguished permanent representative of Belarus claimed that our reports were incorrect, that Mr. Barazenko had been released without being sentenced, and suggested that we be more careful in checking our facts.

Madam Chairwoman, we went back and checked and can verify that in fact, Mr. Barazenko was convicted and sentenced to one year of restricted freedom to be served at home. The fact of this sentence was also confirmed in the December 22, 2008 activity report of the OSCE Office in Minsk which was distributed to all delegations. Mr. Barazenko appealed this sentence and his appeal was dismissed by the Minsk Central District Court on January 13.

We stand by our original statement of December 18 and continue to call on the government of Belarus to honor its international obligations and commitments to respect the human rights and fundamental freedoms of its citizens, and to promote democracy in Belarus.
