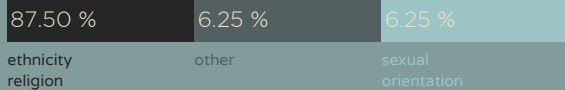

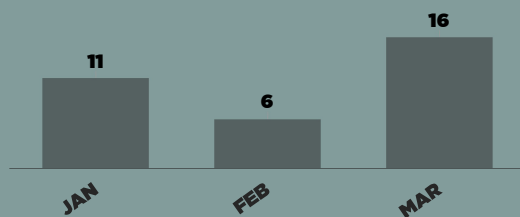

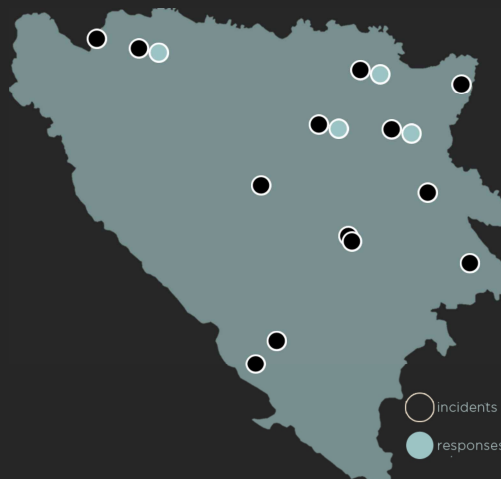

In March, the Coalition against Hate in Mostar organized an exhibition of photos on vandalism in public spaces, titled "Dendroodium". The exhibition publicly alarmed both the institutions and citizens of Mostar on the continuous vandalism and neglect of public property, green areas and monuments. The activity gathered stakeholders and activists to develop a local CCAP to address this issue, with focus on offensive graffiti.
