DECISION No. 282

The Permanent Council,

- I. Acting in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Financial Regulations (DOC.PC/1/96) as approved by the Permanent Council on 27 June 1996,
- 1. Approves the 1999 Budget contained in Annex 1; and
- 2. Approves the OSCE Post Table contained in Annex 2.
- II. Furthermore, the Permanent Council,
- 1. Pending the adoption of the 1999 budget for the Kosovo Verification Mission (KVM), which will take place not later than 31 January 1999, authorizes the Secretary General to incur obligations of up to ATS 300 million in respect of the fulfillment of its tasks, and to bill participating States for amounts up to the level of 50 per cent of the KVM budget approved by the Permanent Council in its Decision No. 266 (PC.DEC/266);
- 2.(a) Decides, in accordance with OSCE Financial Regulation 2.05a, to conduct a general discussion of the budget outline for the year 2000 not later than 31 May 1999. In the framework of this discussion, special attention will be paid to ways of improving the process of preparation of the budget, programme budgeting methods, and financial control mechanisms;
- (b) Further tasks the Chairman of the informal Financial Committee with presenting a report and recommendations to the Permanent Council which will serve as the basis for this discussion;
- 3. Recalling Decision No. 4 of the Oslo Ministerial Council (MC(7).DEC/4), decides to convene a special informal Financial Committee meeting with experts from capitals, not later than 30 April 1999, to study ways of further strengthening the operational capacities of the OSCE. This meeting will also review progress in the implementation of paragraph 5 of Decision No. 8 of the Copenhagen Ministerial Council (MC(6).DEC/8);
- 4. Tasks the Secretary General with considering the relevance of nominating a Deputy Director of the Conflict Prevention Centre (CPC) and reporting his findings to the Permanent Council no later than 31 March 1999;

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- 5. Pending conclusion of negotiations on an OSCE training strategy, agrees that funds will be allocated on a provisional basis within mission budgets for training programmes in 1999 and tasks the informal Financial Committee with reviewing the allocation of these funds to ensure the funds approved match the approved training strategy;
- 6. Decides that a review of the budget for OSCE Tasks in Bosnia and Herzegovina will take place should municipal elections not be held in 1999;
- 7. Tasks the OSCE Mission to Bosnia and Herzegovina with seeking a commitment by the authorities of Bosnia and Herzegovina to finance the Project 8.1, "Ballot Production", within the election part of the Mission budget; in the event that such financing cannot be obtained through the Bosnia and Herzegovina authorities, further tasks the Secretary General with issuing a call for voluntary contributions to cover these costs. Should voluntary contributions not be pledged by 30 April 1999, the Mission is authorized to obtain funding for this project through the transfer of funds from other parts of its budget;
- 8. Tasks the Secretary General with reviewing the permanent staffing of the Secretariat whenever the number or scale of large OSCE Missions decreases, in order to ensure that its strength is proportionate to its reduced tasks;
- 9. Recalling its Decision No. 249 (PC.DEC/249), notes that funds committed for the implementation of the Information Systems Strategic Plan, which foresees three-year non-recurrent investments, will not form part of the baseline figure for future budget negotiations;
- 10. Tasks the informal Financial Committee with conducting periodic reviews of the implementation of the Information Systems Strategic Plan and related information technology proposals and of the presentation of information technology programmes in OSCE budgets, and with reporting its findings to the Council. Such reviews shall be conducted on the basis of reports furnished by the Secretary General, including details of the budgetary implications of these information technology programmes. Further tasks the Chairman of the informal Financial Committee with establishing a roster of information technology experts to assist in these reviews;
- 11. Recognizing the significant level of resources committed to travel and related costs within this budget, tasks the informal Financial Committee with reviewing the OSCE's travel policies with the aim of enhancing the cost-effectiveness of travel budgets and the clarity of their presentation in OSCE budget documents and with presenting a report and recommendations to the Council by 31 July 1999. This review should take account of the best practices contained in the travel policies of other international organizations and of the participating States;
- 12. Recognizing the growing complexity of the OSCE's procurement requirements, tasks the informal Financial Committee with reviewing the OSCE's procurement procedures and with presenting a report and recommendations to the Council by 31 July 1999;
- 13.(a) While reiterating its commitment to secondment as the basis of ODIHR Election Observation Missions, agrees that funds should be allocated on an exceptional basis in

- 1999 to hire On-Site Election Co-ordinators and necessary support staff if no suitable secondments can be provided by the participating States;
- (b) Tasks the Director of the ODIHR with seeking such secondments in good time before the launching of each ODIHR Election Observation Mission;
- 14. Recognizing the importance of gender mainstreaming in the OSCE, calls upon participating States to provide voluntary contributions to assist the focal point on gender issues in staffing;
- 15. Encourages the Secretary General, in consultation with the Chairman-in-Office, to examine the possibility of appointing within the OSCE Secretariat additional focal points to deal with issues of common interest to the participating States;
- 16. Calls upon participating States, partners for co-operation, Mediterranean partners for co-operation and other States, as well as international organizations and institutions, to consider making voluntary contributions, in particular towards the support of large-scale Missions and the ODIHR:
- 17. Reaffirming the importance of the economic dimension of the OSCE, encourages participating States, partners for co-operation, Mediterranean partners for co-operation and other States, as well as international organizations and institutions, to contribute to the Voluntary Fund for Activities Related to the Economic Aspects of Security. Should appropriate funds not be identified by 30 July 1999, the Permanent Council will review the practice of financing economic and environmental seminars, based on a report prepared by the Secretary General.
