Statement by the Permanent Mission of Turkey at the 762nd Meeting of the Permanent Council (28 May 2009)

Mr. Chairman,

We warmly welcome Ambassador Semneby to the Permanent Council. Mr. Ambassador, we appreciate your efforts which are aimed at contributing to the

well-being of a region which has a special and an important place in our national

agenda. We thank you for sharing with us today your observations and

assessments on the situation in the region.

As you have eloquently explained, since your last address to the Permanent

Council, circumstances in some parts of the South Caucasus, unfortunately have

deteriorated, despite occasional and relative sense of positive prospects in other

parts.

The already complex nature of this geography has been further aggravated by

the war between the Russian Federation and Georgia in August 2008. Since

then, the Chairmenship-in-Office have strived tirelessly to normalize the

situation as part of international efforts. Turkey has supported them, including

their endeavours to preserve the OSCE's presence in Georgia and the "status

neutral" approach underlying their suggestions to this end.

In the face of existing destabilizing tendencies peace and stability in the region

are by no means guaranteed.

Apparently as one of the instruments that operationalize EU's Neighbourhood

Policy, we welcome the Eastern Partnership initiative which encompasses the

countries of the South Caucasus region. Here I would like to emphasize the

complementary character of the objectives set forth in the context of this

initiative and our proposal to establish a Caucasus Stability and Cooperation

Platform which is another manifestation of our strong interest in the region. We

believe that these two initiatives could create a synergy. Cooperative study of

options and sharing perceptions on possible steps forward would optimize their

effectiveness. Turkey, in this vein, is ready to act in a forthcoming manner.
