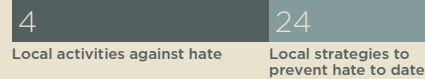

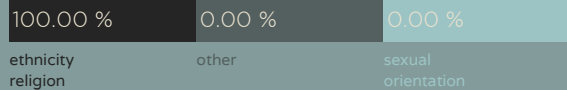

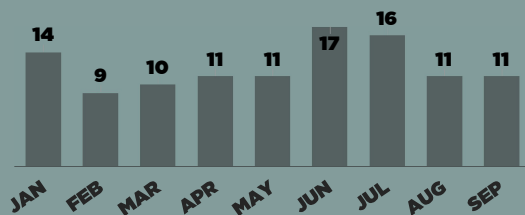

In September, the working group for development of a new Community Cohesion Action Plan in Gradačac commenced its activities. Composed of representatives of the city administration, police, social welfare centre, Coalition against Hate and CSOs, the WG will conduct a public survey on citizens' perceptions and experiences of hate-motivated incidents, the results of which will be used as a baseline for future preventative measures.

The Hate Monitor provides an update on all potential hate-motivated incidents and responses known to the OSCE Mission to BiH at the time of publishing the report.
