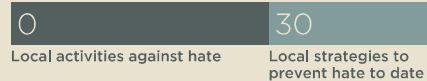

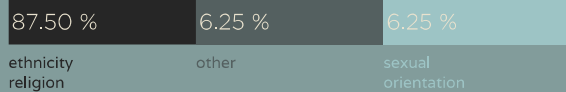

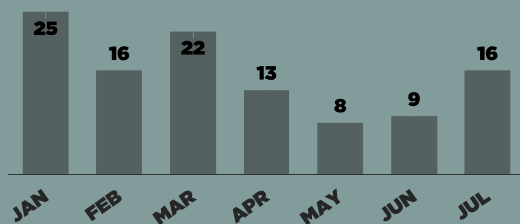

In July, two women's associations in Janja (near Bijeljina) launched an inter-ethnic initiative to tackle the shared priorities of all female members of the community.
