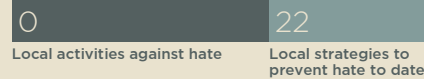

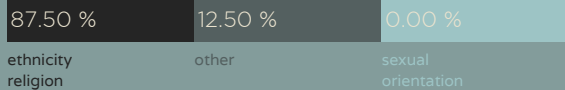

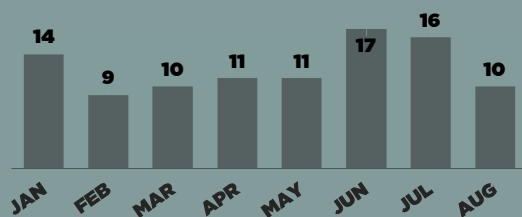

Tuzla Coalition against Hate has long advocated for citizens to take better care of public property, cultural heritage and the environment. As part of this work, in August the Coalition decorated public stairways with 143 footsteps painted in a variety of geometric shapes and incorporating traditional Bosnian motifs, helping raise citizens' awareness of the value of cultural diversity.
