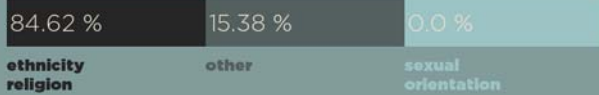

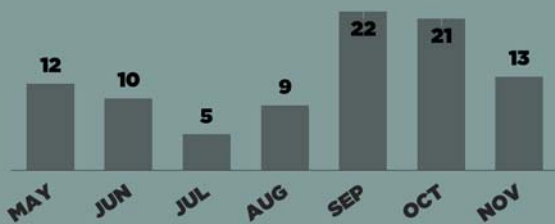

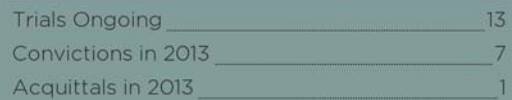

On 16 November, the International Day for Tolerance, thirteen organizations from Prijedor, including both Serb and Bosniac war veteran associations, signed a Memorandum of Co-operation and established "First Tolerance Prijedor" Coalition against Hatred aiming to build community security through tolerance, and pledged to condemn all bias-motivated incidents and hate crimes.
