OSCE Chairmanship's Special Envoy met Personal Representative on the conflict dealt with by the OSCE Minsk Conference

BRUSSELS, 23 March – The Special Envoy of the Chairmanship, Senator Pierre Chevalier, met the Personal Representative of the Chairman-in-Office on the conflict dealt with by the OSCE Minsk Conference, Ambassador Andrzej Kasprzyk, for an exchange of views on on the latest developments concerning Nagorno-Karabakh.

OSCE Chairman-in-Office concerned over continuous detentions amid postelection developments in Belarus
