II. PARTICIPATION

- 1. The Mediterranean Partners for Co-operation (Algeria, Egypt, Israel, Jordan, Morocco, Tunisia) will attend all the sessions and make contributions to all the meetings.
- 2. The Partners for Co-operation (Japan and the Republic of Korea) will be invited to participate in and contribute to the Seminar.
- 3. The OSCE Parliamentary Assembly will be invited to participate in and contribute to the Seminar.
- 4. The following international organizations and institutions will be invited to participate in and contribute to the Seminar: European Union/Barcelona Process, International Committee of the Red Cross, Mediterranean Forum, Organization of African Unity, Organization of the Islamic Conference, United Nations, United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights, United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees, United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization, United Nations Environment Programme, United Nations Economic Commission for Europe, Council of Europe, League of Arab States, North Atlantic Treaty Organization, Western European Union, Black Sea Economic Co-operation Organization, Organization for Economic Co-operation and Development, European Bank for Reconstruction and Development, South-Eastern European Co-operation Process, Commonwealth of Independent States and Asian Regional Forum.
- 5. Representatives of non-governmental organizations will be able to attend and contribute to the Seminar in accordance with the relevant OSCE provisions and practices (advance notification required).
- 6. Other countries and organizations may be invited by the host country.

III. TIMETABLE AND OTHER ORGANIZATIONAL MODALITIES

- 1. The Seminar will begin at 9.30 a.m. (opening ceremony) on 30 October 2000 and end at 6.30 p.m. on 31 October 2000.
- 2. The opening and closing sessions will be chaired by a representative of the CiO.

- 3. Each session will have a moderator and a rapporteur appointed by the Chair. The consolidated summary will be forwarded to the Permanent Council for further consideration.
- 4. Appropriate arrangements for press coverage will be made.
- 5. The working language will be English. At the request of several participating States, interpretation will be provided from and into French. These arrangements will not constitute a precedent that can be relied upon in other circumstances.
- 6. Other rules of procedure and working methods of the OSCE will be applied, *mutatis mutandis*, to the Seminar.
- 7. Rooms for additional ad hoc meetings will be made available to participants. Such meetings will be held without interpretation.
