In June, the OSCE Mission to BiH and World Vision distributed parcels of food and personal hygiene items to 171 Roma families in nine municipalities, and to 310 families in need in an additional eleven municipalities. Local social cohesion groups identified potential beneficiaries and assisted the Mission in delivering this much needed assistance, in many cases to remote areas.
