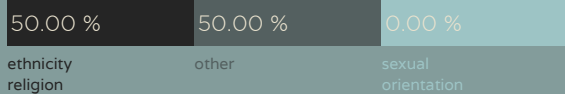

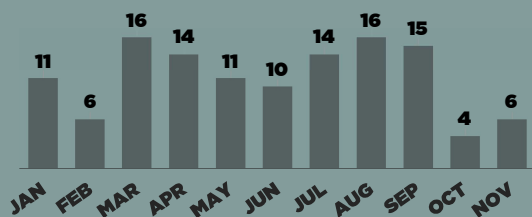

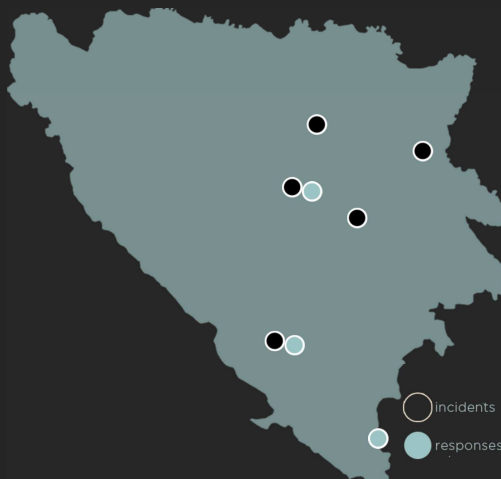

From 11 to 18 November in nine locations across BiH, 31 Coalitions against Hate marked the International Day for Tolerance for the fifth consecutive year. Over 850 citizens engaged in activities that included interaction between youth and senior citizens, programs highlighting cultural diversity for elementary school pupils, and sharing positive stories from the war and post-war period based on inter-ethnic tolerance and coexistence.
