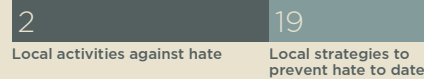

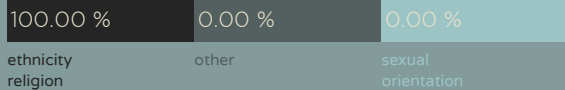

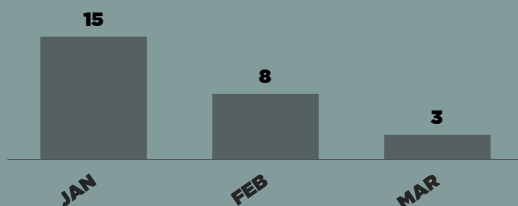

On 6 March, the Coalition against Hate Sloga, Municipal Multi-Sector Team for the prevention of domestic violence and OSCE supported a campaign on community cohesion and countering domestic violence in Gornji Vakuf – Uskoplje. The campaign included a theater performance of the play “Hidden shadows”, placing the spotlight on violence against women and children in BiH society. More than 130 people took part.
