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EU response to the Coordinator of OSCE Economic and Environmental Activities, Mr. Bernard Snoy

The European Union warmly welcomes the Coordinator of the OSCE Economic

and Environmental Activities, Mr. Bernard Snoy to the PC and thanks him for

his report.

The EU reiterates its position that as a security and cooperation organization,

the OSCE has an important role to play in areas where there is a link between

security and the environment. We recall the importance of making full use of

the organization's comprehensive approach to security in order to build

confidence, promote stability and to respond to threats and challenges to

security resulting from economic and environmental factors. The EU supports

any effort of the OSCE aimed at stimulating political dialogue, including at a

sub-regional level, on the role of economic development and environmental

protection in furthering and maintaining peace, stability and security.

We have listened with great interest to Mr. Snoy's presentation of the main

findings and recommendations of the Joint OSCE-UNEP Environmental Mission

to Georgia to assess the environmental consequences of the recent conflict.

The EU would like to thank Mr. Snoy for the efforts taken and fully supports his

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approach, which underlines the relevance of the second dimension for conflict

prevention and confidence building.

Mr. Chairman, the European Commission and the High Representative for the

Common Foreign and Security Policy in March of this year submitted to the

European Council a paper on Climate Change and International Security. In

this paper it is said, inter alia, that climate change is to be seen as a threat

multiplier which exacerbates existing trends, tensions and instability. The EU

believes that the OSCE, within its mandate, and respecting the leading role of

the UN, can address this issue, which may become a source of tension or even

conflict between participating States.

As stated on 19 June, the EU believes that we all need to look ahead and

promote a more strategic view in the second dimension in order to build upon

the progress made in this field. The EU welcomes the launch, by the Finnish

Chairmanship, of debate on the future orientation of the economic and

environmental dimension. Long-term planning, continuity, prioritization, focus

on environmental and economic issues linked to security, as well as OSCE

involvement on security consequences of environmental challenges are issues

of high priority for the EU.

Finally, as this is Mr. Snoy's last appearance before the PC, we would like to

avail ourselves of this opportunity to convey our high appreciation for his

excellent work throughout his mandate and wish him all the best for his

personal and professional future.
