Mr. Chairman,

The Delegation of Ukraine warmly welcomes the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Foreign Affairs and Trade of Ireland H.E. Mr. Eamon Gilmore to the special meeting of the Permanent Council.

We take this opportunity to congratulate the incoming Chairman-in-Office with his country's OSCE Chairmanship in 2012.

The Delegation of Ukraine welcomes priority areas of the Irish Chairmanship in all three dimensions. We commend the approach of the incoming Chair to preserve continuity in the work of the OSCE Chairmanships. In this regard Ukraine is looking forward to working closely with Ireland in the OSCE Troika next year.

As OSCE Chairmanship of 2013, we attach particular importance to the fulfilment of tasks mandated by the leaders of the OSCE participating States in Astana. We share the view that without enhanced effort and political will on the part of all participating States we cannot move closer to the realization of the vision of a free, democratic, common and indivisible security community across the OSCE area, to which the leaders of the OSCE participating states recommitted themselves in Astana.
