STATEMENT BY THE DELEGATION OF LUXEMBOURG

Mr. Chairman,

In response to the request for assistance by the Ukrainian authorities on the basis of the OSCE Document on Stockpiles of Conventional Ammunition, the Government of the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg has decided to donate 20,000 euros to support the project for humanitarian demining and cleaning up of the Novobohdanivka ammunition site and surrounding area.
