III. Timetable and other organizational modalities

The Conference will begin at 9.15 a.m. (opening session) on 18 May 2010 and end at 1.30 p.m. on 19 May 2010.

The opening and closing sessions will be chaired by a representative of the OSCE Chairperson-in-Office or a representative of the host country.

Each session will have a moderator and a rapporteur. The consolidated summary will be forwarded to the Permanent Council.

Rules of procedure and working methods of the OSCE will be applied, *mutatis mutandis*, to the Conference.

The opening and closing sessions will be open to the media.

The Conference will be held in Seoul, Republic of Korea.

The working language will be English.

On the margins of the Conference, a side event on "Women's contribution to security" will be held.

A report from the side event will be produced and forwarded to the Permanent Council.

Side event(s) will be chaired by a representative of an OSCE participating State or institution.

Other rules of procedure and working methods of the OSCE will be applied, *mutatis mutandis*, to the Conference.

Rooms for additional ad hoc meetings will be made available to participants. Such meetings will be held without interpretation.
