DECISION No. 755 FORWARDING OF DRAFT DOCUMENTS TO THE MINISTERIAL COUNCIL

The Permanent Council.

Decides to request the Chairperson of the Permanent Council to transmit to the Chairperson of the Ministerial Council the following documents:

- Draft statement on Nagorno-Karabakh;
- Draft ministerial statement on the presence of OMiK;
- Draft decision on organized crime;
- Draft Brussels declaration on criminal justice systems;
- Draft decision on further measures to prevent the criminal use of lost/stolen passports and other travel documents;
- Draft decision on countering the use of the Internet for terrorist purposes;
- Draft Brussels ministerial statement on supporting and promoting the international legal framework against terrorism;
- Draft decision on the future transport dialogue in the OSCE;
- Draft decision on energy security dialogue in the OSCE;
- Draft ministerial statement on migration;
- Draft decision on combating intolerance and discrimination and promoting mutual respect and understanding;
- Draft decision on enhancing efforts to combat trafficking in human beings, including for labour exploitation, through a comprehensive and proactive approach;

- Draft decision on combating sexual exploitation of children;
- Draft decision on strengthening the effectiveness of the OSCE;
- Draft decision on improvement of the consultative process;
- Draft decision on the legal status and privileges and immunities of the OSCE;
- Draft decision on further strengthening the effectiveness of OSCE executive structures;
- Draft decision on the time and place of the next meeting of the OSCE Ministerial Council;
- Draft decision on the future OSCE Chairmanship;

Recommends to the Ministerial Council the adoption of the above-mentioned documents;

Further recommends that the decision on the time and place of the next meeting of the OSCE Ministerial Council be placed under a silence procedure with the period of silence expiring on Friday, 8 December 2006, at 5 p.m. CET.
