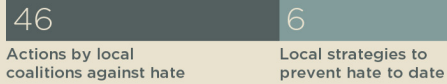

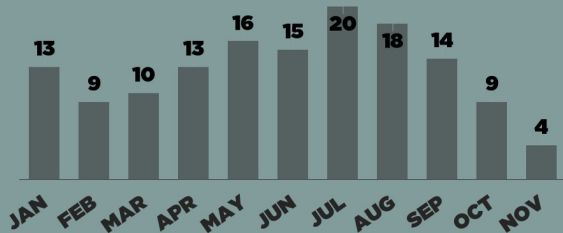

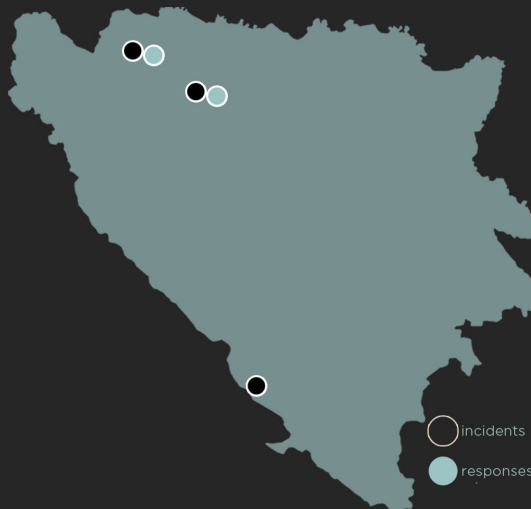

During the Month of Tolerance campaign, from 16 October to 16 November, the Coalitions against Hate implemented 50 activities in 19 locations across BiH, with the aim of encouraging citizen engagement in the advancement of tolerance and mutual understanding, and promoting positive stories related to diversity and inter-ethnic and inter-religious co-operation.
