II. ORGANIZATIONAL MODALITIES

Participation

Representatives from interested participating States Representatives from OSCE institutions Representatives from international organizations NGO representatives Secretariat staff

The Seminar may be conducted in five working sessions from Monday, 17 to Wednesday 19 May 1999.

The working sessions will be chaired by representatives of the Host State, other OSCE participating States and the Secretariat.

The working language will be English.

The following international organizations will be invited to attend and to contribute to the proceedings of the Seminar: UN, United Nations Mission in Bosnia and Herzegovina (UNMBIH), Office of the High Representative, European Bank for Reconstruction and Development (EBRD), United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights (UNHCHR), United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR), United Nations Economic Commission for Europe (UN/ECE), Council of Europe, World Bank, International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC), NATO, Stabilization Force (SFOR), Western European Union, Black Sea Economic Co-operation (BSEC), Central European Initiative (CEI), Southeast European Co-operative Initiative (SECI), Royaumont Process, European Union, Co-operation Process of South-East Europe (SEE).

Mediterranean partners for co-operation, as well as Japan and the Republic of Korea will be invited to participate in and contribute to the proceedings of the Seminar.

NGO representatives may attend and participate in accordance with OSCE rules (advance notification required).

The Keynote speakers will be requested to provide their statements in writing in advance. Duration of interventions (except for the opening session) should be limited to 15 minutes.

Other rules of procedure and working methods of the OSCE will be applied, *mutatis mutandis*, to the Seminar.
